

TOURNAMENT RULES

1. Venue:

Sports Club Thamesmead: Thamesmead, London, SE28 8NJ

2. Pitch size:

● Full size natural and artificial grass certified FIFA 2 STAR

3. Age category:

- U-14 players born after 1st of January of 2008 and younger
- U-15 players born after 1st of September of 2006 and younger

4. The number of players / staff entered into the tournament:

● 18 players and 4/6 coaching staff

5. The system of play:

- 2 groups made of 5 teams
- Qualification games are played between teams in the group once (4 games)
- Games will be played 1 period of 30-minutes long /10 min interval in-between games
- Standing order:
 - Number of points; (3 points for the win, 1 point for a draw, 0 points for a loss)
 - Mutual result
 - Goal difference
 - Goals scored
 - Penalty shootout (sudden death)
- Final stage: 1 game 1st of each group will play in the final, remaining teams will play for the places based on the rule: 2nd gr A vs 2nd gr B, 3rd gr A vs 3rd gr B (each based on the results of the qualification stage)

6. Regulations:

- Playing time: 1x30 min.
- The number of players on the pitch: 11 (10 + goalkeeper)
- Substitutes: Rolling-on (within the zones, maximum of 3 periods of substitutions)
- Goals size: Full size
- Football size: 5
- Footwear: AG or moulds (NO STUDS) and Studded boots are allowed
- Shin pads are mandatory
- A penalties spot: 11 m
- Free Kick: UEFA regulations
- Corner: UEFA regulations
- Throw in: UEFA regulations
- Offside: UEFA regulations
- GK distribution: UEFA regulations

7. Cautions:

- Yellow - warning
- Red – 5 min sin bit and player can't return on the pitch at the same game, after 5 min play can be substituted
- Deliberate time wasting (2 min sin bin)
- NO TO RACISM – PLAYERS/ STAFF WHO MAKE ANY FORM OF RACIAL OFFENCE MIGHT BE EXCLUDED FROM THE TOURNAMENT

8. The final interpretation of the Rules and Regulations game belongs to the Organizer

9. Awards:

- Individual: MVP , Tops scores, Top GK
- Teams: each Player will receive a memorable medal
- 1st 2nd and 3rd place will receive trophy each and medals

10. Other information:

- Organizer does not insure players! All clubs are asked to comply with relevant insurance club policies
- Each participating club of the tournament is obliged to strictly comply with the Internal Regulations of the venue and accommodation of the event
- In matters that are not included in the Regulations' booklet, and having an impact on the course of the tournament. The Organizer has a right to make a final decision.
- Changing rooms and room for video analysis etc will be provided in one of the classrooms
- Warm-up area will be provided but limited
- VIP ROOM available- only for coaching and designated staff

COVID - REGULATIONS

**We are serious about the safety for all participants.
We apply the following rules and measures to prevent the spread of Coronavirus:**

-
- To **wear face mask** is recommended NOT mandatory when moving around the venue (apart from own designated zone and playing time)
- **Hotel dining is exclusive** just for the event (no sharing with the public),
- Minimal number of teams at the time at the venue
- Designated warm up areas for teams
- International teams will be asked to come change to the hotels, so **changing rooms** will be provided for local teams.
- **One way movement** through the corridors (separate entrance and exit)
- **Staggered arrival times**
- **No teams photo (joined)**
- International teams will have **privet designated transport**
- All teams will be asked to **conduct** players and staff **health check** by their club doctor or physiotherapist prior their departure to the tournament
- Any player with **COVID- Flu symptoms are asked not to travel** to the event

Travel to England rules

When you travel to England, you do not need to:
complete a UK passenger locator form before you travel
take any COVID-19 tests before you travel or after you arrive
quarantine when you arrive

This applies whether you are vaccinated or not.
It includes people who are transiting through England.

Other countries may have rules about what you need to do to leave the country to travel to England. You should check travel advice for the country you are travelling from.

How to stay safe while in the UK and on public transport

Travel provider and transport hub rules

Tournament Protocols

Changing rooms and shelter

Allocated changing rooms will be assigned between 2 teams BASED ON THE ROTA, Teams are required to move their belongings to the designated (by club Logo) are at the gym in the main buildings. Stewards on arrival will direct all teams to their changing rooms. The organiser is not responsible for any valuables left unattended. It is the clubs responsibility to take care of players and their belongings.

Catering (packed lunches)

International teams are provided with all meals. UK based academies are required to bring their own packed lunches. Food court is available at the event. Club staff will be permitted to free tea and coffee from a catering station.

Medical

Each participating club is required to attend with a physiotherapist for their own team.

Paramedics will be present on-site during match time (including warm-up and cool-downs).

Paramedics details:

Location of the Medical Room:

Medical room is available by the changing room area. Ice is available from the canteen upstairs.

Location of Paramedics:

Two paramedics will be stationed in between pitches. In case when they will be required, pitch monitor will radio them for their attendance.

Location of Player Ambulance:

The ambulance will be parked at the carpark facing the exit. This location will be identified during pre-event briefing.

Transportation to Hospital:

Depending on the severity of the injury, the route will either involve the individual being transported across the playing area and into the ambulance or the paramedic vehicle being taken onto the field.

Club Medical Provision - Staff & Equipment

All Clubs must be accompanied by a fully equipped physiotherapist, qualified as per Youth Development rules for the duration of the Tournament (including at the accommodation if applicable).

Clubs are asked to bring their full pitch side emergency equipment.

Paramedics

A paramedic crew and ambulance will be on site for the duration of the tournament.

Medical Liaison Personnel

Designated Medical Liaison Officers will be available for the duration of the event. The Medical Liaison Officers will conduct a briefing with Club physiotherapists prior to the commencement of matches (as soon as the Coaches' Briefing ends).

Treatment Room

There is a treatment room in the Sport Centre Pavilion, available for Club use if required during the tournament.

Drinking Water/Ice

Drinking water is available via a water tap at the Sport Centre Pavilion. Clubs need to bring their OWN water bottles for the event. Upon request, ice will be available from canteen upstairs. Please contact our staff if you require ice.

Medical Records

Club medical staff must have immediate access to all player medical records, parents' contact details and the Club senior medical support staff.

Emergency Response Procedures Introduction

While every effort will be made to ensure that the event proceeds smoothly, it is imperative to plan for unforeseen circumstances in order to ensure the safety of all participants.

Emergency Incident

Event staff will:

- Establish the nature and extent of the emergency.
- Contact emergency services. Emergency services will assume primacy in dealing with the incident.
- Make sure that all participants are accounted for and safe (with the support of Club staff).
- If there are injuries, establish the names of those injured, the extent of their injuries and call for the appropriate medical assistance (with the support of Club staff).
- Ensure that appropriate adults (Club/event staff) accompany players to hospital whilst ensuring that the remaining players are adequately supervised. Parents/legal guardians in attendance may accompany their child. Event staff dealing with the emergency must be made aware of such arrangements to ensure the whereabouts of all participants are known. The organiser is to be made fully aware of any situation - and the action taken - as soon as practically possible.
- Record and report information to the relevant authorities.

Club staff will:

- Support the event staff.
- Ensure the Club's Home Contact is made aware of the incident and arranges to contact the parents/legal guardians of those involved where appropriate.

Non-Emergency Injuries and Illness

Non-emergency injuries are likely to be controlled and resolved within the event venues. Event staff will assist Clubs with managing non-emergency injuries or illnesses that require medical attention outside of what is available at the event. Club staff will accompany their players to the appropriate medical care facility.

Emergency Evacuation

The event staff will brief Club staff on emergency evacuation plans upon arrival.

Club staff should ensure that their players understand the emergency evacuation procedures and know the assembly points for all venues. Club staff should walk the emergency routes with their players to increase awareness.

Safeguarding Concerns

All Club and event staff must be vigilant and respond appropriately and swiftly to safeguarding concerns and incidents by reporting immediately to the TDA safeguarding delegate.

Safe Practice Plan

Limited pitch-side shelter is available. Please ensure your team is adequately clothed and prepared for all weather eventualities.

In non-emergency situations, tournament staff are not able to accompany Club staff on A&E transfers. For these non-emergency situations, it is the Club's responsibility to ensure that they can manage and cover the cost of the transportation of staff and players to and from hospital facilities and return to the tournament venue or home if required. Please ensure that your best safe practice plan for such an event is known to all attending staff in line with your Club policies prior to travel.
